First, some background...

What is External Relations?



- It's all the following:
 - **Public relations**: key to all of this is building relationships with our membership and external stakeholders
 - Capacity building: technical training, Internet governance, providing expertise to different policy-making bodies, supporting development of technical communities
 - Coordination: bringing together our members, different types of communities and organisations, I* orgs and industry partners, sharing knowledge and experience
 - Staying ahead of the curve: following regulatory changes, technical trends, and changing environments that affect our members and other stakeholders

What do we do?



- We are the eyes and ears of the RIPE NCC
- Our membership and the RIPE community come first - we can't do anything without understanding their needs
- Position the RIPE NCC as a key player on the topics that matter to our members and the RIPE community

Overarching Strategy

 - First figuring out what everyone wants from us
 - Then figuring out what we can offer and how to have the most effective impact possible

Western Europe: Approach




- Participating in and contributing to community events across the region (NOGs, IXP meetings)
- Working with political intelligence firm to follow
 EU policy and regulation
 - Maintaining relationships with Europol, EU Commission
- Managing engagement in global governance arenas (ITU, OECD, UN)
- Working with business stakeholders to understand market pressures
 - Became member of the Alliance of Internet of Things Innovation (AIOTI)

- Big focus on capacity building
 - IPv6 Roadshows, Train the Trainer program
- New initiatives for specific stakeholders
 - First Regional Roundtable for Governments and Regulators
 - Seminars for law enforcement agencies
 - Central Asian IGF

Eastern Europe & Central Asia: Approach



- More local engagement
 - More and more national and local meetings that let communities focus on their particular issues and opportunities
- Focus on translations
 - Wiki project to encourage community-led translations

Middle East: Approach



- More tailored training, capacity building for specific stakeholders

- Helping to kick-start national NOG discussions (Iran, Palestine, Yemen)

Middle East: Approach



- Started academic initiative that brings together students from universities across the region
- RIPE NCC now seen as centre of expertise that can bring together different players
 - As a result, we're now invited to the table


